General Reminders for Students

In order to maintain a safe, orderly campus, all students must respect campus rules, policies, and procedures. Some reminders...

- Students may not be in the A-building unless they have school business (early dismissal, replacement ID card, counseling appointment, detention or other behavior issues.) Students may not enter the A-building without an acceptable purpose.
- Students must follow the directions of adults at all times on campus.
- Students may not receive Door Dash or other food deliveries. Food deliveries that arrive on campus will be held until the end of the school day.
- Students must remain on campus at all times, except in the case of an early dismissal.
- Breakfast is served until 8:25 am each day. Students may not stand in line for breakfast after that time.
- Students must be on time to each and every class during the day.

Students who fail to respect the school rules, policies, and procedures will receive school discipline.

PSAT Day

This Wednesday, October 12th, all 9th - 11th graders will take the PSAT. This is a great opportunity for students at each of these grade levels to practice for the SAT. For sophomores, it's a great way to practice for the PSAT/NMSQT in 11th grade, which qualifies them for the National Merit Scholarship Program and a chance to win recognition and money for college. Seniors will participate in college readiness activities while the other students are testing. Please make sure that 9th - 11th grade students are well-rested, and encourage them to eat a healthy breakfast on Wednesday. All students will attend shortened periods 1 - 6 after lunch.


Blue Crew Activities 10/17 - 10/19

Blue Crew mentors will visit 9th grade English classes on Tuesday, 10/18 to talk with freshmen about meeting on Wednesday, 10/19 during the last part of their 4th period class. On Wednesday, freshmen will be released 25 minutes early from 4th period to meet with their Blue Crew mentors in the quad. There, they will hear important information about getting involved on campus, including Homecoming. They will all be released to

Attendance

As we've shared before, all Rosemont students are responsible for maintaining good daily attendance. Students who miss just two days each month are considered chronically absent and have a significantly increased risk of failing classes and failing to stay on-track for graduation. Our attendance goal is 95% for every student. Currently, we are at 92.1% for the 22-23 school year with a 25.9% chronic absenteeism rate, which is concerning.



Please make sure that your student is attending school every day, unless they have an unavoidable emergency or experience COVID-related symptoms. If your student needs assistance with attendance, please don't hesitate to reach out to his or her counselor. Let's work together to ensure that our students are in school every day!!!!! National Bullying Prevention Month



October is National Bullying Prevention Month. Please review this <u>information about bullying</u>, including what bullying is, how to look for signs that your child is being bullied, and how to report bullying. We prioritize the safety of all of our students and take this issue very seriously. PLEASE reach out to site administration or counselors at any time about incidents of bullying.

Sacramento City Unified to Make Narcan Available to All Schools Starting Week of October 10
We are reaching out to our SCUSD community with an important public health message about the dangers of opioid use impacting our community. Sacramento County has experienced 174 deaths due to opioid overdose in 2021, impacting children as young as 15 and older. The California Department of Public Health recently released an alert about a new trend called "Rainbow Fentanyl," (an extremely potent and dangerous synthetic opioid), which is found in pills, powders and blocks in a variety of bright colors, shapes and sizes resembling sidewalk chalk or candy. Fentanyl continues to be a major contributor to drug overdoses in California, including among youth.

In response, SCUSD is adding another life-saving rescue medication to all our school sites by providing Narcan nasal spray for use during a suspected opioid overdose. All our school sites have a number of emergency and rescue measures at their disposal, including AEDs to restart heart rhythms, Epi-Pen auto-injectors in the case of a severe allergic reaction, and now Narcan nasal spray.

SCUSD Health Services has obtained free Narcan to distribute to our school sites through the California Department of Health Care Services Naloxone Distribution Project. We will be distributing Narcan to all school sites throughout the week of October 10th.

We urge all our SCUSD community members to learn about the signs of opioid overdose and speak to our children, family members, friends and colleagues about the dangers of opioid use.

- Encourage open and honest communication
- Explain what fentanyl is and why it is so dangerous
- Stress not to take any pills that were not prescribed to you from a doctor
- No pill purchased on social media is safe
- Make sure they know fentanyl has been found in most illegal drugs
- Create an "exit plan" to help your child know what to do if they're pressured to take a pill or use drugs
