Perpetual Focus on Instruction

Please continue your focus on the following:

1. Clearly post and share [Learning Intentions for All Students](#) for each class each day. A learning intention should include what students will know or be able to do by the end of the period as well as a measurable proving behavior. We will be visiting classrooms this week looking for learning intentions.
2. To support a bell-to-bell culture of instruction, hold students accountable for starting an activity immediately as the class begins. This could be an inclusive opener or some other task that requires that students are on time and ready to begin.
3. Have students work collaboratively to develop classroom expectations for behavior.
4. **Incentivize being on time to class.** Take points away from the opening activity, for example, if students are tardy.
5. Teach students your classroom procedures (how to enter the classroom, how to move in and out of collaborative groups, how/when to ask questions, etc.) to provide structure and consistency.
6. Review the Language Frames for whole-group and small-group dialogue. Posters have not yet arrived, but [here](#) is a copy of what you'll receive. Another great idea is to print out and laminate a class set to be used whenever you want to reinforce their use.

Cell Phone Policy

Including this again because it has been a good start for those who have been using the system and want to emphasize the policy.

Campus expectation is that all teachers support phones coming out only when there is a clear signal from the teacher, regardless of how you let them be used thereafter in your class.

- How we will support this at Rosemont
 - Classroom Level – Depending on the teacher’s classroom room policy, electronic device violations can be addressed through: prompts, phone cubbies, paper lunch storage bags, calls home, etc. Before it becomes a power struggle that interferes with instructional time please call the office for a pick up.
 - Campus Monitor Level – If a student does not comply with the device policy a campus monitor or administrator will pick up just the device and the device will be returned to the student according to the following progression:
 - 1st offense: After class
 - 2nd offense: After school
 - 3rd and beyond: Must be picked up by the parent or guardian.
 - Administration Level – If the student does not want to turn the device over and return to class then the student will come to the office and the device will be checked in. Parents/Guardians will be contacted to pick it up. Students will then be returned to class.
